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DRAMATIZATION

This presentation may be made very beautiful by dressing the Bubble Girl and the Chorus in dainty pastel shades. We can supply such costumes made of tarlatane in all rainbow shades at \$ 2.50 each. A beautiful effect will be gained if each girl in the chorus has a large balloon tied by a long string to her wrist, simply letting the balloons float about as they walk and dance.

The curtain rises to disclose at center front the *BUBBLE GIRL* seated on her stool. At her feet is a very large bowl brimming with suds. In her hand is a long clay pipe. She waves it gracefully as she sings.

FIRST VERSE— On "So won't you please" the *BUBBLE GIRL* holds pipe towards audience. After the last line of this verse she blows bubbles over the foot-lights as the *CHORUS* enters, all carrying pipes and swinging them to rhythm as they sing.

CHORUS — The *CHORUS* gathers around bowl, after their song is sung, dipping pipes, one at a time, until they are all blowing bubbles while *BUBBLE GIRL* sings the next verse.

SECOND VERSE— At the end of this verse the *BUBBLE GIRL* dips her pipe in the suds and blows bubbles out to the audience while the *CHORUS* dances and sings.

THIRD VERSE— While the *BUBBLE GIRL* sings, the *CHORUS* continues to trip lightly about playing with their balloons and blowing bubbles. The chorus is sung as before.

FOURTH VERSE— The *CHORUS* continues their dancing and blowing of bubbles. At conclusion of song all sing the chorus and then blow bubbles as the curtain falls.
